## ARRANMORE LIGHT



Inspired by the breathtaking scenery of Ireland and made in the county Donegal, Arranmore Light is a wonderfully full yarn perfect for knitters looking ahead to plan a winter project.

# SEPTEMBER Cherry Bark



Cherry Bark is a classic slipover designed by Sarah Hatton featuring a textured stitch pattern across the back, and comes with two neck options. The first option is a roll neck with a plain stocking stitch front, and the second option is a wide crew neck with a front texture panel.

Yarn: 3 [3: 4: 4: 4: 4: 5: 5: 6] hanks of **Arranmore Light** Launch: September 2021

Sizes: Standard 9 sizes

To fit a chest circumference: 76-81 [86-91: 97-102: 107-112: 117-122: 127-132: 137-142: 147-152: 157-162] cm (30-32 [34-36: 38-40: 42-44: 46-48: 50-52: 54-56: 58-60: 62-64] in)

The fall of leaves and first touches of frost that marks October makes this delightfully lofty yarn, made from 100% pure lambswool, perfect for those looking for soft, enveloping warmth.

## Echinacea



Echinacea is a relaxed hat that combines a classic gansey motif with a single Tree of Life cable column. The majority of the hat uses a knit/purl and reverse stocking stitch motif on the background of plain knitting.

Designed by Karie Westerman from Glasgow, Scotland, this hat is knitted in the round where the rib edging organically grows smoothly into the body of the diamonds and cable.

Yarn: 1 hank of Lore Launch: October 2021

Sizes: S [M: L]

To fit head circumference: 46-51 [51-56: 56-61] cm (18-20 [20-22: 22-24] in)



## CUMBRIA FINGERING



Settling down for days spent more indoors, November signals a month for Cumbria Fingering, a soft yet strong yarn ideal for timeless projects that will last. This yarn makes beautiful fabrics for special occasions as well as everyday knitwear.

## NOVEMBER Milk Thistle



Milk Thistle, designed by Béatrice Mase, is a textured kite-shaped shawl featuring a unique flower design. The sample is knit in the shades Scafell Pike, Fair Hill and Blackbeck, and has been designed so that each shade has a different stitch pattern; garter and stockinette stitch in Scafell Pike, herringbone stitch in Fair Hill and a stunning flower stitch in Blackbeck.

Yarn: 4 hanks of Cumbria Fingering, 2 hanks of colour A and 1 each

of colours B and C Launch: November 2021

Sizes: One size

Wingspan along top edge: 212 cm (83.5 in)

Depth: 47 cm (18.5 in)

# DECEMBER TUNDRA Tundra is a bulky yarn with a pleasing rounded appearance that creates luxurious fabrics to keep you warm. It is ideal for sweet and cosy winter accessories as it knits up quickly in time for December's seasons greetings.

# DECEMBER Lady's Mantle



Lady's Mantle is a radial yoke cowl that is worked from the top-down like the round yoke of a roll-neck sweater. Short rows are used to dip the front and back, at which point it becomes less like an unfinished yoke and more of a capelet. Designed by Lily France from Lancashire in the UK, this chunky neckwarmer is perfect as a gift or small project to keep you or a loved one safe and warm.

Yarn: 2 hanks of **Tundra** Launch: December 2021

Sizes: One size

Circumference at neck: 45 cm (17.75 in)

Depth: 29 cm (11.5 in) at back, 39 cm (15.25 in) at front



## Garrow



Yarrow is a loose-fitting circular yoke pullover worked seamlessly from the top-down. Inspired by the classic Scandinavian-style and designed by Marie-Amélie Madignier, Yarrow is worked top-down and ends with a slightly puffy effect at the wrist.

Yarn: 3 [3: 3: 4: 4: 4: 5: 5: 6] hanks of colour A and 1 hank each of colours B and C in Cumbria

Launch: January 2021

Sizes: Standard 9 sizes

To fit a chest circumference: 76-81 [86-91: 97-102: 107-112: 117-122: 127-132: 137-142: 147-152: 157-162] cm (30-32 [34-36: 38-40: 42-44: 46-48: 50-52: 54-56: 58-60: 62-64] in)
